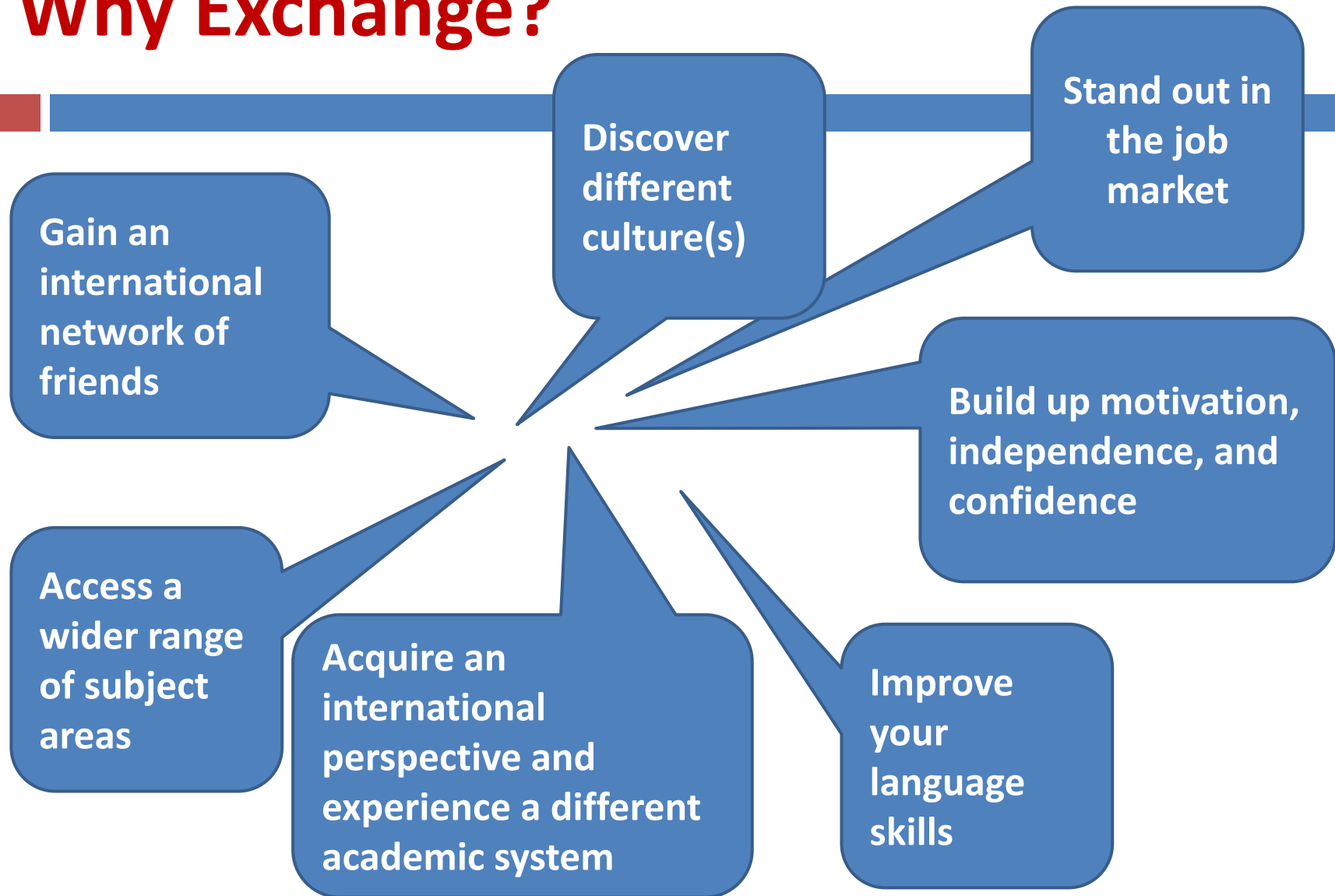

Why Exchange?



How to Choose the Global Exchange Destination?

- Research and consider the following:
 - Availability of courses (in English) that can be transferred towards OzU graduation requirements.
 - Some institutions may offer interdisciplinary programs and a limited number of English courses for exchange students
 - No overlap in academic semesters
 - Services offered: housing, orientation, support services etc.
 - Cost of living (housing, residence permit/visa, food, health insurance, travel, etc.)
 - Cultural, social, travelling opportunities
 - Suitable semester in order to graduate on time and not to adversely affect the flow of your studies here at OzU
- Other professional and/or personal preferences
- Attend to OzU IO info sessions, visit partner institutions' exchange student pages, talk to former exchange students, exchange program coordinators and the OzU IO

How to apply?

- You can only study at a partner institution as an exchange student.
- Fall or Spring
- Courses taken will be transferred and counted towards OzU graduation requirements.
- No tuition fee at the host institution, continue to pay your regular OzU fees.
- All personal expenses (accommodation, travel, insurance, food, visa /residence permit etc.) during exchange are your responsibility.
- In some institutions fees such as application, insurance may be applicable.
- **Qualification to apply:** CGPA \geq 3.00, 30 ECTS+.
- **Qualification to be nominated:** Faculty Jury Evaluation/Placement, CGPA \geq 3.00, 60+ ECTS, language requirement of the respective partner.
- Evaluation: CGPA, language proficiency, Interview with your Faculty Jury.

How to apply?

- Faculty Juries evaluate students from academic, social, linguistic and cultural perspectives so you should be able to express yourselves thoroughly in all these terms.
- **TOEFL/IELTS** required for most partners; min. score may vary 80 - 100 (IBT), 6.5 IELTS or PTE (***Students who will be nominated for Fall 2017 must take it by Feb. 2017, students who will be nominated for the Spring 2018 must take it at the latest by June 2017.***)
- ***Students who do not meet the min. language requirement of the respective partner institution will not be nominated by OzU.***

How to apply?

- ❑ This list is not exhaustive and both home and host institutions may ask for additional information before and during the evaluation phase.
- ❑ You must sign the personal and financial commitment at the time of accepting your placement.
- ❑ Please note that there are always risks associated with graduation delays due to the fact that priority courses may not be taken at the host institutions or course lists may change at the very last minute.
- ❑ Quotas available are subject to change at the discretion of the partner institutions.
- ❑ You may apply for both Erasmus+ and Global Exchange. If you are slotted to both programs for the same semester, you must withdraw from one within the deadline presented by the IO.

Nomination & Application to the Partners

- ❑ OzU IO nominates placed students in line with the partners' deadlines.
- ❑ Only after the official nomination, placed students may fill out the exchange application form of the partner institution.
- ❑ Please respect the evaluation period of the host institution & wait for the decision patiently.
- ❑ Acceptance is never guaranteed!
- ❑ Follow the documentation/correspondence from partners since partner institutions may communicate directly with candidate students after the nominations.

Admitted Students

After Receiving Acceptance from the Partner:

- Finalize your **STUDY PLAN** with your Exchange Program Coordinator
- Take care of your visa, insurance, travel, accommodation etc. arrangements – **YOUR OWN** responsibility
 - ▣ Some countries (i.e. USA, Canada) have strict deadlines/rules on visas and immigration.
- Follow course registration information sent by the host institution.

After the Exchange Period:

- After the exchange, Faculty/School/ Institute Executive Board transfers the credits/grades earned based on the **Transcript of Records** from the host institution.

Global Exchange Necessary Documents

- **Partner institution application package will most likely include:**
 - ▣ Application Form , Health Reports, Financial Documentation, Passport copy, Picture, CV, Statement of Purpose , English OzU Transcript, Language Proficiency Document , Provisional course selection
- **Study Plan**
 - ▣ Must be prepared before departure
 - ▣ The list of available courses at the host institution may change at a later stage. Thus this list must be finalized in the beginning of your exchange term.
 - ▣ Course registration depends on the partner institutions' rules & regulations. Follow them accordingly.
- **Further documentation** (course registration, health insurance, immigration/visa related etc.)
