

Guidelines for Erasmus English Language Test

The aim of these guidelines is to familiarize Erasmus candidates with the type and content of the test they are required to take before they are chosen as an Erasmus Program student abroad. The test mainly focuses on the academic reading and writing skills and it will take 90 minutes. During the test students are expected to answer questions on the following areas:

Part 1 – Critical Thinking and Textual Analysis

This section tests students' reading comprehension through justified answers to open-ended questions focusing on

- 1.1. The author's attitude /tone and purpose
- 1.2. Main idea and supporting ideas of the text
- 1.3. Inferences

Part 2 – Analytical Reading into Writing (responding critically to the text)

This section requires students to write a fully organized paragraph of about 300+ words in which they respond critically to the given article. While doing so, they are expected to justify their arguments with specific evidence from the text, using proper academic referencing styles such as direct quoting and/or paraphrasing.
