We realized that some students should have paid more attention to the rules when choosing their DOUBLE MAJOR and MINOR. Therefore, we would like to remind you a few points so that you do not have problems afterwards.

First, the prerequisites of our courses have changed in line with the new curriculum. Therefore, you cannot take the courses for which you do not complete the prerequisites. In other words, you must successfully pass the prerequisite courses to be eligible for taking your double major/minor courses.

For double major students: Please review the attached rules. Double-major students must have completed at least **306 credits** to be eligible for graduation. The common courses in both majors are only counted toward the primary major program. As a result, you are expected to take the **program courses** to complete 306 credits in total.

- Students double majoring in the Faculty of Business programs should consider that there will be several common courses between programs. When you run your Degree Audit system, you can see this.
- However, if you are from the Faculty of Engineering or other Faculties and double majoring in the Faculty
 of Business Programs, you will have a few common courses. When you run your Degree Audit system, you
 can check this. When you run the Degree Audit system, if you have completed all the courses in the second
 major and complete the remaining credits with 306 credits in your primary major, you are considered to
 have completed the second major.

We would like to remind our minor program students that they have to take the prerequisite courses before they take the core courses within the program. If you are minoring in the Faculty of Business programs, you may have taken most of the courses you need to take in your primary major program. However, these courses are only counted toward your major. To complete a total of **270 credits**, which is the requirement for graduation from minor programs, you must complete your remaining credits by taking the program courses. (For example, if you are studying International Finance and minoring in the Economics Program, you will see that the four core courses are the same in both programs. As such, you have to take the program courses of the minor program and complete your total credits as 270 instead of the common four courses. You will only see the core courses when you run your Degree Audit system. However, completing the core courses does not indicate that you have achieved the total credits for graduation. Do not let this mislead you. Even if you have completed your core courses, you must have completed 270 credits, including the total credits on the back page.

Students from other faculties minoring in Business Administration Programs encounter this situation less frequently.
