

- **What is the difference between GPA and graduation CGPA?**

GPA is the grade point average of all courses you take in a semester. The graduation CGPA is the grade point average of all courses that you have taken to date and are counted towards your total credit load.

- **When performing a degree audit to check my eligibility for graduation, which GPA should take into account? GPA or graduation CGPA?**

Your eligibility for graduation is determined based on your graduation CGPA. Your graduation CGPA must be a minimum of 2.00 in order to be eligible for graduation.

- **Where and how can I check my graduation requirements?**

You may check your graduation requirements either on the graduation requirements page prepared for each program specifically on the Faculty of Business website or via the SIS. Also, you can perform a degree audit on the SIS to see to what extent you have completed your graduation requirements and your remaining courses.

- **Can I take courses from another institution during the summer session?**

Yes, you can take courses from another institution during the summer session. If you will graduate at the end of Summer School, you can take your Required courses, Program Elective or Free elective courses from another institution. However, if you cannot graduate at the end of summer school, you can only take free elective courses from another institution.

- **I have only one course left to be eligible for graduation. However, my faculty does not offer the course in the next semester. In order not to delay my graduation, can I take this course from another higher education institution and graduate at the end of the semester?**

If you have only one remaining course (mandatory/program elective/free elective) in order to be eligible to graduate at the end of the semester, you may take a corresponding course from another institution in lieu of the OzU course subject to the Faculty Executive Board approval.

- **I am not a graduation candidate. Can I still take mandatory courses from another institution during the summer session?**

Only graduation candidates may take mandatory courses from another higher education institution during the summer session.

- **What should I do in order to take a course from another higher education institution?**

First of all, you need to find a course that is offered by another higher education institution and that you believe corresponds to the mandatory/elective course you must take. Once you find a course, you must share the course syllabus with your department head to obtain his/her approval. Upon the approval of your department head, you must write a petition addressed to the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Business, and submit it to the [faculty administrative secretary](#) (with the course syllabus and the approval of the department head attached).

- **What should be the language of the course that I will take from another higher education institution?**

The course must be fully English-medium.

- **If I take and complete a course from another higher education institution, what will be the next steps?**

After you successfully complete the course, you must obtain a transcript from the host university, and submit this document to the [faculty administrative secretary](#). Once all necessary reviews are made, course substitution will be granted, and Student Services will be notified.

- **If I fail from the course I took from another higher education institution, will course substitution still be granted?**

No, course substitution will not be granted for failed courses.

- **How can I be a TA?**

TA openings are periodically announced via Link Professional. You can follow these announcements, and apply for the TA openings that best fit you. Students who are admitted as TAs must contact their [faculty administrative secretary](#) for part-time employee enrollment in Social Security.

- **How many PE-coded courses can I take?**

Effective from 2019-2020 academic year, a maximum of two PE coded course can be taken in all undergraduate programs. For more information, please click [here](#).

- **Can I take BE and HUK-coded courses?**

You can register for BE or HUK-coded courses but as the language of instruction is Turkish for these courses, they will not be counted towards the graduation requirements of your major/double major/minor program. These courses are not included in credit or GPA calculations.

- **I am a BAIBUS student. Can I change my required-elective language course?**

Students registered on academic programs which offer foreign language courses as required electives in their curricula may change the course they chose only once in the following semester, regardless of the course repetition rules in the rules and regulations. - **I have completed my maximum period of study (14th semester). What will be the next steps? Will I be expelled from the University?**

- **Do we have the right to sit composite examinations during the summer session?**

No, you cannot. No composite examination is held for courses offered during the summer school.

- **I missed my composite examination. Can I take a make-up examination?**

No, you cannot. No make-up examination is held for final examinations or composite examinations.

- **I achieved a passing grade in my final examination. However, I would like to enhance my grade. Can I sit the composite examination?**

No, you cannot. Students cannot take composite examinations for the courses they passed (i.e. to enhance their grade etc.).

- **I could not take my final examination due to health problems. I have sick leave. Do I need to submit it?**

No, you do not need to submit it. Students who have met the eligibility requirements for their final examinations, but, for any reason, either were unable to take or failed their final examinations may sit for composite examinations.

- **My scholarship is terminated. I would like to apply for a scholarship. What should I do?**
